Exercise 16. Which of the functions IP, E, $\oplus K_i$, S, P in the encryption procedure of the Data Encryption Standard (DES) are linear?
(A function is said to be linear if $f(X_1 \oplus X_2) = f(X_1) \oplus f(X_2)$ with addition modulo 2.)

Exercise 17. Let M be a block of bits of length 64 and K be a block of bits of length 56. Let $\text{DES}(M, K)$ denote the encryption of M with key K using the DES cryptosystem. Show that

$$\text{DES}(M, K) = \overline{\text{DES}(\overline{M}, \overline{K})},$$

where $\bar{\cdot}$ denotes the bitwise complement.

Exercise 18. There are four so called *weak* DES keys. One of those is the key

$$K = 00011111\ 00011111\ 00011111\ 00011111\ 00001110\ 00001110\ 00001110\ 00001110.$$

What happens if you use this key? Can you find the other three weak keys?
